REPORT OF THE HONORARY GENERAL SECRETARY

1. General

When compiling this report of the activities of the Guild, its officers and members, it is difficult to determine what should be put in and what should be left out in order to keep it to a manageable length each year. Future historians of the Guild would prefer an extended report; present economic conditions favour a brief one. This year the report has an altered format and we have changed the printer: both of these will save money. If you have any criticism to make, please let the officers know, don't nurse a grievance!

1975 saw the first funds flowing into the Oxford Diocesan Bell Fund. After a slow start one or two areas have responded well, thinking up money raising schemes of their own. Individual response has, however, been poor.

The team entered by the Guild for the Tewkesbury Shield Competition won it, and a full account can be found later in the report. Mr. F. J. Orchard presented a cup to be given to the winners of a striking competition to be held annually between the Central Bucks and the Chiltern branches. The Chipping Norton branch again had a successful festival, whilst the presence of the Expo Belfry at Appleton during the Spring Bank Holiday helped in raising a considerable sum of money for their restoration work. This is the first time that the Expo bells have been erected in the diocese.

Congratulations are due to Mr. L. Stilwell on ringing his one thousandth peal at the age of 85; he is easily the oldest ringer to do so, his nearest rival being a mere 75! He becomes the fifth resident ringing member of the Guild to join this exclusive peal ringing fraternity.

It is sad to report the continuing illness of our former Master, Canon C. Elliott Wigg. He is confined to bed, and would welcome news of your ringing activities, although he is not able to answer them.

Two of our members have had extensive tours overseas. Mr. T.G. Holden, the secretary of the Witney and Woodstock branch, visited Australia for three months and rang at five towers. Miss M. R. Cross, who is well known for her teaching expertise, spent several months in Houston, Texas, imparting some of her ringing knowledge to the band at St. Thomas's church.

Towards the end of the year the Master issued the fifth and final volume of his monumental work "The Church Bells of Herefordshire." This completes one of the largest and most comprehensive books in the

county series, and certainly the most illustrated, the photographs also being the work of Mr. Sharpe. Copies of all five volumes have been presented by him to the Guild Library.

2. Membership

Despite the increase in the subscription to 50p, the number of resident members rose slightly last year.

Of the 239 new members elected, 23 were non-resident life members. Losses through death were 19, so either 187 members refused to pay their subscription or left the Guild during the year. Should we regard this 10% turnover of members as the norm?

Some branches declined in numbers yet again. The Banbury branch now has fewer members than at any time since the 1950's, and the East Berks and South Bucks branch is at its lowest ebb since 1965. The Vale of White Horse branch, with only 27 members, must surely be nearing the minimum number for successful operation. On the other hand, the North Bucks branch has had its best year since 1961 with a 55% increase in membership. Finally, the Reading branch with its 14% increase regains its place as the third largest branch in the Guild.

As mentioned earlier, nineteen members died during the year, including several who had been members since before the First War. A complete list is given on another page, and details of their careers in some of the branch reports. May they rest in peace.

Four branch secretaries retired this year. Cyril Kinch, the popular secretary of the Bicester branch held the post for 27 years, and the branch showed their appreciation by making a gift to him at their annual dinner. He has been succeeded by Cliff East. Dick Miles had an extremely difficult job as secretary and treasurer of the Vale of White Horse branch for ten years; members of the branch and guild are grateful to him for keeping the spirit of the Guild alive in this isolated area of the diocese. John Browne took on the post of temporary secretary till a replacement could be found. Doreen Stoneham has taken over from John Apsley as secretary of the South Oxon branch after he had ably filled the position for two years. In the Chipping Norton branch

Ken Wakefield has replaced Margery Slate as secretary after she had served the branch and Guild quietly and faithfully for three years. We thank all of these retiring officers, and wish their successors a happy term in office.

3. Meetings

The General Committee, in whom the government of the Guild is vested, again met twice during the year, in March and September. Grants of £50 were made from the Restoration Fund to Shinfield, Bradfield and St. Giles, Reading, and one of £100 to Appleton. The subscription was raised again for resident ringing members, this time to 60p, a modest increase considering the rate of inflation. The latter led to the reassessment of the insurance on the Guild's property: the library is now insured for £1,000, the handbells for £400, the striking contest cup for £100 and the banner for £400. The price of the annual report was revised — they were being sold at below cost price — in future they will be 30p. A sub-committee was appointed to examine the production and content of the report, and given the power to go ahead with the preparation of the 1975 one without referring back to the General Committee. This may lead to the formation of a new sub-committee when the General Committee meet again!

The Annual General Meeting was held at Beaconsfield on the first Saturday in July. Many members enjoyed ringing in the morning at towers in the East Berks and South Bucks branch before attending the service held in St. Mary's church. This was conducted by the Master and the Rector, Rev. P. Nott, who also gave the address. Over 100 members were present at the meeting which took place in the Old Rectory. The officers were all re-elected with exception of Barry Davis, who retired as one of the Stewards and whose place was taken by Henry Lawrenson. The grant to the Ringing World was increased to £20, and it was decided that a history of all the Guild's treasures should be compiled. An excellent tea was supplied by local ringers, after which members returned home, ringing at more of the towers in this large branch.

Ten towers took part in the Guild Striking Contest at Finchampstead, one of the most southern towers in the diocese. It was a hot Summer's day, and the pleasant surroundings enabled those present to laze in the sunshine, listening to the ringing. Wilfrid Wilson, who judged the contest, commented on the excellent standard of the ringing, and awarded first place to Easthampstead, second to Thatcham, third to Caversham and fourth to Wantage. It was a particularly happy occasion for Easthampstead, it being the first time that the Guild finals had been held in the Sonning Deanery branch and the first time the branch had won them.

The Annual Festival was held as usual on the first Saturday in October. Once again the Cathedral was crowded for the Festival service. the address being given by the Archdeacon of Oxford, the Ven. C. Witton-Davies, and the service being conducted by the Master. The Luncheon that followed was attended by 140 members and their guests, speeches being made by the Deputy Master, the Archdeacon of Oxford, John Baldwin and Henry Lawrenson. Ringing took place afterwards in the city and the South Oxon branch.

4. Publicity

Six towers from the diocese have been featured on the cover of the Ringing World — Waltham St. Lawrence and Appleton in January, North Leigh in April, St. Giles, Reading and Little Missenden in July and Hughenden in September. The Ringing World editor assisted at the Easthampstead Park course and gave it extensive coverage, including several photographs. The striking contest, A.G.M. and festival reports were all published, together with photographs of the latter. Some branches sent up accounts of their meetings and other events: the Editor would publish more if correspondents could be found.

The Master arranged an exhibition in Gloucester Cathedral that produced some excellent publicity; he also gave five lectures on campanology during the year. The General Secretary was interviewed concerning the Oxford Diocesan Bell Fund, and the resulting article appeared in the Newbury Weekly News, the Oxford Mail and the North Berks Herald. This followed by a five minute broadcast on Radio Oxford.

Five branches continue to produce newsletters: Banbury, Newbury, Old North Berks, South Oxon and Witney and Woodstock. Excerpts from these are regularly published in the Ringing World. They are a valuable means of communication between members of a branch, and in many cases are eagerly sought by ringers who have little other interest in the Guild.

5. Repairs and Maintenance

One of the important aspects of Guild work carried out by the Master is the inspection of bells, their gear and the towers in which

they are situated. On a request from an incumbent or a P.C.C. he will visit any tower in the diocese for this purpose. They should, of course, pay any travelling expenses. During 1975 he reported on eight towers in Berks, eight in Bucks and fourteen in Oxfordshire. In four cases he made a return journey to talk with the P.C.C. or an architect. He gave advice for ten complete restorations, i.e. new frames, gear, tuning and sound control. In addition he gave advice on tower oscillation and repairs to masonry in seven towers; on redundant bells in two churches; on an Ellacombe chiming apparatus in one church; three cases of augmentation; two of recasting; on maintenance and repairs in twelve churches; on rehanging bells with new gear in existing frames in six churches; on fifteen cases of sound control and twelve of tuning.

Two trebles have been added to the six at Aston Clinton, making this the second eight in the Chiltern branch. An account of the dedication, with photographs, appeared in the Ringing World. Three trebles were added at Bodicote, making this the lightest ring of eight in the Banbury branch. St. Giles Reading have been rehung with new fittings; the dedication of both of these was reported in the Ringing World. Repairs to the stonework of Burford and Churchill towers have been completed, work still remains to be done at Iffley and Wallingford.

Four bells have been lost to the Guild. The church at Hatford was declared redundant, and despite attempts to find the light ring of four a new home in the diocese, they were sold privately with the church. They have since been sold to the church at Lemsford, Welwyn, Herts, where there is a plan to augment them to six.

6. Finance

The General Treasurer reports: "At 31st December 1975 three branches had not paid the proportion of members' subscriptions due to the Guild for 1975. The amount due from the South Oxon branch was received on 7th January 1976 but at the date this report was written the amounts due from the other two branches, Vale of White Horse and Witney and Woodstock, had still not been received.

At the end of 1975 the Banbury, Vale of White Horse and Witney and Woodstock branches had not paid for the Guild Reports which they had been supplied with and the Oxford City branch had only paid for 15 out of the 20 they had had. At the date this report was written all these amounts were still outstanding.

Due to the above, the accounts for the year cannot show the financial position of the Guild accurately. Will Branch Secretaries and

Treasurers please co-operate by sending the proportion of members' subscriptions due to the Guild to the General Treasurer by 1st December in accordance with Branch Rule F. This rule also calls for a copy of the audited statement of accounts to be sent to the General Treasurer each year. Although some branches have already forwarded copies of their 1975 accounts those for South Oxon, Vale of White Horse and Witney and Woodstock branches for 1974 were still awaited at the date this report was written.

Early in the year every P.C.C. in the diocese whose church has bells was circularised regarding the Restoration Fund, and as a result a total of £291.60 was received in donations from 132 parishes. These figures include 30 parishes which had never donated to the Restoration Fund before. The previous highest total was £104.15 from 98 parishes in 1960."

7. Education and Training

The General Committee elect a small sub-committee each year to co-ordinate the teaching of ringing throughout the diocese. Advice or assistance will be provided by them to any branch or tower which would like to run any sort of ringing course on any topic, from plain hunting to surprise methods. The sub-committee reports as follows:

"The major event on the committee's calendar is the residential course at Easthampstead Park, held on the last weekend in September. Over 40 students attended the 1975 course and voted it a success. The committee is grateful to all the lecturers who gave their time and the incumbents who gave permission for their bells to be used during the weekend. As will be seen from the Guild accounts, the course again covered its expenses. Preparations are already well in hand for the 1976 course which will be extended to three days.

A very successful half-day course on Stedman was held at Harwell but other courses on handbells and Double Norwich and Cambridge were cancelled because of lack of support. Lecturers were provided for half-day courses in the Banbury and Reading branches and a number of other courses are being planned, partly as a response to publicity of the committee's responsibilities and capabilities; Marie Cross' teaching activities also extended outside the Guild.

Two more pamphlets were produced. "So you want to be a Ringer" points out the advantages (and disadvantages) of ringing to anyone considering learning and Educational Leaflet No. 4, "Belfry Care and Maintenance" is a comprehensive guide to the work needed to keep bells in ringing order. These and other pamphlets are available from the General Secretary.

The Chairman of the committee was elected chairman of the Central Council Education Committee in May, thus ensuring a close liaison between the two committees. The latter held the first of a series of discussion meetings on teaching techniques at Newbury in November.

Marie Cross was not available for the last quarter of the year having accepted a post in Houston, Texas for six months and the committee strength was maintained by retaining the services of Bill Birmingham who stood down last year. The typing services of Daphne Pollard were again put to good use, and the committee would like to thank her for all her work."

8. Oxford Diocesan Bell Fund

As may be seen from the accounts, the income for the first accounting period of the fund amounted to £1,589.41 on the Capital Account and £29.25 on the Income Account. From the latter must be deducted the management expenses, which include the cost of launching the campaign, amounting to £119.75, leaving a deficit of £90.50 to carry forward on the Income Account.

However, as the market value of the Fund's investments on the 31st December 1975 exceeded their cost by £102.97 the net realisable value of the assets less liabilities is £1,501.88.

For comparison, the equivalent figure for the Guild's Restoration Fund was £1,949.94. If the outstanding grants are deducted this reduces to £1,649.94.

The General Treasurer has compiled a very interesting table showing the source of income to the fund. It clearly shows how each branch has responded to the appeal. If we are to reach our target in the forseeable future some branches will have to face up to their responsibilities in a more tangible manner.

9. Miscellaneous

Besides the work carried out by the Master listed in sections four and five he has attended twenty meetings, the Easthampstead course and represented the Guild at three funerals.

The Deputy Master reports as follows: "Apart from attending meetings and practices in various parts of the Guild, I was able to deputise for the Master at the dedication of the bells at West Wycombe and St. Giles Reading. I also carried out inspections of the work at these two

towers so that grants from the Restoration Fund could be made.

I organised the band which successfully competed in the Tewkesbury Shield Competition. I feel that this type of contest provides good publicity for the Guild and I was particularly pleased that several of our prolific peal ringers were prepared to take part.

I again lectured at the Easthampstead course although I was not able to stay the whole weekend. This has now become well established and provides a valuable contribution to ringing education within the Guild. It is gratifying to see that the organisers consider it worthwhile extending it to three days in 1976.

As Central Council representative I attended my first Council meeting at Lincoln. It was particularly relevant that the Council has set up a committee to co-ordinate the activities of Bell Restoration Funds. I have had some correspondence with this committee on behalf of the Oxford Diocesan Bell Fund and I feel that it is important that we keep in touch with other similar projects in this way.

I have been involved as a Managing Trustee with the launching of the Oxford Diocesan Bell Fund and I am extremely disappointed with the poor response from ringers to the Guild-wide appeal. Of course there are exceptions and a few people have done a lot of hard work towards raising money but the number of people prepared to covenant is disappointingly small. I feel that everyone must be prepared to pay more for their ringing activities and I believe that the only answer will be an automatic levy attached to the Guild subscription."

The Guild Librarian has prepared an up to date library list, and has also revised the record of the Guild peals. Copies of both are deposited in the library and with the Report Editor and General Secretary. Two books have been presented to the library by their authors. The Master has presented the final volume of the "Church Bells of Herefordshire" and Mr. B. J. Gatward his booklet "Summoned by Bells".

Fourteen of the fifteen branches of the Guild are covered by the four Stewards. Mr. D. G. Wheeler is responsible for the North Bucks, Central Bucks and Chiltern branches, and attended all their branch meetings. Mr. H. Lawrenson is the Steward for the Newbury, Reading and Sonning Deanery branches; he reports that since his election he has not been able to visit two of these but hopes to rectify this in the coming year. Mr. P. G. Davies visited all four of the branches for which he was originally steward; the four for which he is now responsible are Old North Berks, Vale of White Horse, Witney and Woodstock and the Chipping Norton. Mr. D. Cornwall is Steward for the Bicester, South Oxon, East Berks and South Bucks and Oxford City branches.

During 1975 I attended twenty-three Guild, branch and committee meetings, three striking contests and two branch social evenings. I attended the Central Council meeting at Lincoln as one of the Guild's representatives, and four committee meetings as chairman of their Education Committee. Unfortunately the administrative work of the Guild precludes my taking part in as much practical ringing with branch members as I should like: I hope to rectify this when the members decide to dispense with my services as General Secretary!

THE TEWKESBURY SHIELD

In 1971 a festival was held at Tewkesbury in Gloucestershire to celebrate the anniversaries of two historic events, the consecration of the Abbey Church of St. Mary-the-Virgin on October 23rd, 1121 and the Battle of Tewkesbury on May 4th, 1471. Several souvenirs were produced to commemorate the festival year and one of these consisted of a limited number of Spode plates depicting the borough coat-of-arms and the arms of some notable local families.

One of the Spoke plates was purchased by a local fund-raising body, the Theocsbury Charity Committee (Theocsbury is the old name for Tewkesbury) and mounted on a wooden shield. Local organisations were invited to submit ideas for an annual competition for which the Shield would be the trophy. The suggestion of an annual inter-association striking competition on the Abbey's bells was accepted and thus was born the Tewkesbury Shield Competition.

The first competition took place on June 9th, 1973 and was restricted to 8 bells. In fact the test piece was a touch of 252 Stedman Triples. Two teams each from the Gloucester & Bristol Association, the Worcestershire Association and the Hereford Diocesan Guild were invited to take part. The competition was won by G. & B's first team with 81 faults beating Hereford's first team into second place with 91 faults. During the Evensong which took place in the Abbey after the competition, the Shield was carried to the High Alter where it was blessed by the Bishop of Tewkesbury.

The same three associations competed in the second competition on May 11th 1974 when the test piece was a plain course of Cambridge Surprise Major. On this occasion the O.D.G. was well represented by the three judges, Jim Diserens, John Baldwin and Colin Monson. Again G. & B. were placed first with Worcestershire second this time, scoring 37 faults and 50 faults respectively.

In 1975 it was decided to widen the scope of the competition and teams from the St. Martin's Guild, the Bath & Wells Diocesan Association and the Oxford Diocesan Guild were invited as well as one team from each of the three "regulars". The Deputy Master, Tim Pett, was given the job of selecting and "coaching" the O.D.G's team. It was decided to hold a practice at St. Mary's, Reading a few days before the competition. St. Mary's was chosen as the bells are of similar weight to Tewkesbury. The team consisting of Neville Diserens (treble) Ken Darvill, David Cornwall, Stan Scott, Tim Pett (conductor), Bernard Groves, Jim Diserens and Peter Davies (tenor) ran through the test piece of 252 Erin Triples a couple of times. A steady rhythm was settled into fairly quickly and there were no disastrous mistakes so the team was brimming with confidence on the day of the competition.

On Saturday, May 3rd, the teams gathered in the Abbey Hall where a colour television had been installed so that those football addicts who were not ringing could watch the Cup Final. The draw for order of ringing was made and the O.D.G. were 4th, a good position as a quick

calculation showed that this would co-incide with half-time at Wembley! The standard was set by the first team and holders, G. & B., with some very good striking which gave us an idea of what we were up against. However, as we were ascending the steps to the ringing chamber, the Worcestershire team were firing out and this calmed our nerves a little as we only had to complete the touch to avoid coming last!

We settled into the test piece, ringing a little quicker than the other teams had done. The touch was completed with only one or two small trips and we were well pleased with our performance. When all the teams had finished, the Bath & Wells team also firing out, the experts seemed to think that it would be a close thing between G. & B. and O.D.G. After Evensong in the Abbey, the results were announced to a packed audience in the Abbey Hall by Bob Smith, the chief judge from Leicester. The O.D.G. team were very surprised and delighted to find that they had been placed first with 65 faults, narrowly beating G. & B. into second place with 68 faults. St. Martin's were just pipped into 3rd place by Hereford with 97 faults to St. Martin's 101.

Each member of the winning team was presented with a beautifully decorated and inscribed certificate by the Vicar of Tewkesbury with a spare certificate for the Guild's library. Traditionally the Shield remains in Tewkesbury Abbey but we were very fortunate in being allowed to have it on display at the Guild's Festival Luncheon in October. Tim Pett thanked the organising committee for inviting the Guild to take part and expressed the hope that we would be allowed to defend our "title" in next year's competition.

That wish has indeed been granted and the Guild has received an invitation to take part in the competition on May 1st, 1976. This year the competition will be on 10 bells and the test piece will be a touch of Grandsire Caters. The Coventry Diocesan Guild and the Llandaff & Monmouth Diocesan Association have been invited to enter teams as well as the O.D.G. and the three regulars. The O.D.G. team will again be organised by Tim Pett who extends an invitation to all Guild members to come and cheer their team to a second victory.

As may be seen from these figures, the total number of peals rung for the Guild in 1975 was 221 of which 177 were rung on tower bells and 44 on handbells. This is exactly the same as the 1974 total.

First as conductor was recorded by Christopher Parkinson (Plain Bob Minor) and Martin Turner (7 Minor Methods). Christopher and Martin Turner rang their first peal on handbells (Plain Bob Minor).

Peals at Bobicote and Whitchurch (Bucks) were the first on the bells; re-hanging at Chalgrove and West Wycombe and the augmentation at Aston Clinton were all celebrated with peals. The peal at Bodicote was for the 50th anniversary of the Banbury & District Branch.

First peals in the method were rung of Bristolish, Hampstead Norreys, Shaw and Water Surprise Minor; Orinoco Delight Major; Mashonaland, Shirburn and an un-named Surprise Major and Redcliffe Surprise Maximus.

Len Stilwell recorded his 1000th peal and Alan Ainsworth his 1000th on church bells. At the other end of the scale, four locals rang together at Langford in their first peal. The Langley handbell band completed the "standard eight" of Surprise Maximus and also rang a record length of 10560 Cambridge Surprise Maximus. Among their other achievements were Spliced Surprise Maximus in 10 methods and the first peals of Lincolnshire, Pudsey and Superlative Surprise Royal on handbells.

Other notable peals included Stedman Cinques at Tewkesbury by the winners of the Shield (plus a little help), a Diserens family peal of Plain Bob Major at Brightwell, Crosland's half-lead Spliced Surprise Major at Hughendon and Spliced Surprise Royal in 14 methods with all the work and every lead different at Newbury. Peter Holden's Surprise Minor band recorded a series of peals working up to 30 methods.

Members representing ten different branches of the Guild rang a sponsored peal of Royal at Thatcham which raised over £200 for the Diocesan Bell Fund. A sponsored peal of Yorkshire Surprise Major was rung by the Sunday service band at Hughendon as part of the centennial celebrations.

Many peals were rung for special occasions; the most notable of these were:— Binfield - A tribute of the life of Frank Tomlinson, ringer and past tower captain. Fulmer - In memoriam Miss Florence Gudgen, a member for many years. Hitcham and Cockham - An 85th birthday compliment to Len Stilwell. Beaconsfield - An 80th birthday compliment to Miss Ethel Fletcher. Long Crendon - A 70th birthday compliment to Mr. S.H. Young (deputy captain) and ringer for 55 years at Long Crendon. Highclere - A Golden Wedding compliment to Reg and

Eva Rex. Newbury - A peal of Plain Bob Major by Old Boys of St. Bartholomew's school to mark the end of the school after 509 years.

ANALYSIS OF QUARTER PEALS

During 1975 the Ringing World recorded 518 quarter peals on 152 different towers in the Guild; 5 handbell quarters were also recorded. Of this total 202 (39%) were rung on a Sunday and 41 (8%) were rung "in memoriam".

This total was composed of:— Minimus 2, Doubles 174, Minor 99, Triples 124, Major 88, Caters 17, Royal 12, Cinques 2.

96 of the quarters (18%) incolved a first of some description and the total number of firsts was 399.

The number rung in each branch was:— Banbury 18, Bicester 18, Central Bucks 32, Chiltern 7, Chipping Norton 17, East Berks and South Bucks 100, Newbury 38, Old North Berks 65, North Bucks 16, Oxford City 45, Reading 51, Sonning 22, South Oxon 39, Vale of White Horse 11, Witney and Woodstock 39.

The most popular methods were:— Grandsire Triples 74, Grandsire Doubles 53, Plain Bob Doubles 49 and Plain Bob Minor 44. Sixty-one quarters of more than one method were rung, almost exactly half of which were Grandsire and Plain Bob together.

The tower recording the greatest number of quarters was St. John, Windsor with 23. Second was Tilehurst with 19. Newbury and St. Thomas, Oxford each recorded 14 all of which with the exception of one at the latter tower were rung on Sundays. The leading tower in Bucks was Long Crendon with 12.

Three branches rang quarters on more than half of the ringable towers in the branch:— Bicester, with 10 out of 16, East Berks and South Bucks with 19 out of 36, and Old North Berks with 18 out of 29.

There is insufficient historical information on quarter peals readily available, so comparisons cannot be made. However, in view of the importance of quarters as a measure of progress, it is hoped to make this review an annual event.
