REPORT OF THE HONORARY GENERAL SECRETARY

1. General

The first quarter of 1976 was marked by the deaths of Frederick Sharpe and Canon C. Elliot Wigg. The Guild owes an immense debt to these men and it was with great pleasure that we elected Miss Sharpe and Mrs. Wigg as Honorary Members at the A.G.M. We wish William Butler every success in his position of Master with the difficult task of following in the steps of his predecessors. We also thank him for his unfaltering devotion to the work of General Secretary for the preceding six years.

The Oxford Diocesan Bell Fund is growing at a steady pace in its build-up of capital, and by the end of 1977 will have enough interest accrued to start making grants. This will, I hope, encourage the fundraising activities further so that the capital may grow faster and the grants may increase.

In the last Report we congratulated Mr. Len Stilwell on ringing his 1000th peal and on being the oldest person at the time of reaching this figure. Now we congratulate Mr. David Brown on being the youngest person ever to ring 1000 peals — at the age of 24 — and he shows no sign of retiring yet. 1976 was an outstanding year for peal ringing in the Guild as you will see elsewhere in this Report.

Miss M. R. Cross has again spent much of the year in Houston, Texas, although she was at home in Abingdon for a few months in the middle of the year.

For the second time the Guild was invited to compete in the Tewkesbury Shield Competition and for the second time the team won it.

William Butler was well in the running for the post of Librarian of the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers, another post which fell vacant on the death of Mr. Sharpe. Although he was not elected, it was a good contest and our new Master is very active in the Central Council committees. All the Guild's Representatives were at the Central Council meeting at Hereford.

2. Mastership

The deaths of Frederick Sharpe and Canon Elliot Wigg within weeks of each other came as a great shock to all members of the Guild. Personally I shall miss their strength, knowledge, leadership abilities and their friendship, as I feel will all of you who came into contact with them. They will not be forgotten for their rich personalities or for the work they have put into the Guild and the art of ringing.

Memorial services were held in Christ Church Cathedral for both past Masters. The preacher at these services was Rev. Gilbert Thurlow, Dean of Gloucester. There were many peals and quarter peals rung to their memory. It now remains for the Guild to decide on the form of the permanent memorial.

Dr. Tim Pett took over as Master following Mr. Sharpe's death until the A.G.M. in July, when William Butler was elected to the office of Master. We must thank Tim Pett for fulfilling so well the role of Master for those months following the unexpected death of Mr. Sharpe.

3. Membership

For the first time ever the Guild is attempting to maintain a full record of membership so that it can be easily referenced. To date any checks on an individual's membership have involved knowing their approximate date of election as well as their record of subscription payment. Our current plan is to compile and maintain at Branch and General Guild levels a full list of members in alphabetical order. It will not be easy even then to ensure that we have a fully accurate record, but the officers feel that it must be greatly superior to the present (non-) system. Non-resident life members present a particular problem in maintaining any index since any resident member moving from the Diocese after sufficient resident subscription payment automatically becomes a non-residential life member. Yet Branch Secretaries are not generally informed in cases where a member's subscription is no longer forthcoming whether that person has given up, died, moved within the Diocese or moved outside.

Membership figures continue to show stability in terms of numbers, but the changes in terms of many new members elected compensating for those who cease membership for one reason or another, as was reported in last year's Report.

Certain Branches have shown a significant increase in membership, in particular the Vale of the White Horse Branch. I believe that their 50% increase is due to the enthusiasm and drive of the Secretary and this has re-established that Branch's liveliness. The Bicester, Reading and Witney & Woodstock Branches have also made significant growths in numbers. On the other hand some Branches show a net loss in numbers of up to 18%. However, like economists in their interpretation of the Trade figures, we should not pay too much attention to just one year's figures. One noticable aspect is that over the years the membership figures have stayed stable in spite of subscriptions rising to keep up

with highly inflationary costs. In 1976 resident members' subscriptions were raised from 50p to 60p.

There have been 5 changes of Branch Secretaryship during the year. I have already mentioned the increased membership figures for the Vale of the White Horse and it is clear that the new Secretary, Mrs. Lyn Oliver is making her mark. Our appreciation goes to John Browne who filled the post temporarily for a year. Geoff Tyler has retired from the Secretaryship of the Central Bucks Branch after 5 years and Mr. A. J. White from the Chiltern Branch after 8 years, both having done sterling work. They are succeeded respectively by Mark Dobson and Mrs. Christine Ottaway. In the Newbury Branch, Andrew Mead has taken over from Roger Pike, who during his period as Secretary saw the Branch's success in fund-raising for the Bell Fund. Miss Elizabeth Barber has resigned as the much-liked Secretary of the Oxford City Branch and Len Porter has temporarily taken over the post. I should like to thank all Branch Secretaries (past and present) for all their work and wish the present ones success in achieving their ambitions.

4. Guild Gatherings

For many years it has been the custom of the Guild to gather together in generally large numbers for three major general events: the Striking Competition (recently moved from May to June), the A.G.M. (in July), and the Annual Festival (in October). However in 1976 we were not able to have a Festival owing to the non-availability of Christ Church Dining Hall. The Hall will not generally be available to us other than in January in the future. Several people have expressed their reservations about the holding of an event like the Festival in early January, and it does seem that there may be changes in the format of events.

To compensate for the lack of a Festival in October, a Ringing Day was held on 2nd October with 37 towers open in Berkshire and Oxfordshire. To judge from the attendance at the towers and the participants' comments, it was a good success and will be repeated (with different towers!) in 1977. As an additional bonus, about £80 was raised for the Bell Fund by a levy (5p) on each ringer at each tower. Tea was not as well supported as would have been supposed from such a large attendance at the towers, which shows that generally, given the choice of grabbing towers or eating a splendid tea, ringers would opt for the former, even if the tea is provided by the Harwell ringers.

The Striking Competition was held at Mursley and as is usual, the standard of ringing was good from the ten competing teams. The Cup went to Amersham, who are to be congratulated since it was the first time that they have been in the Guild competition. Second place went

to St. Mary's, Reading; third place to Newbury; and fourth place to Abingdon.

At the Branch level, there continue to be a range of social and ringing activities in addition to meetings and practices. Full details can be found in the Branch Secretaries' reports elsewhere in this Report. Unfortunately the prices charged by hotels, etc. for a traditional Dinner or Dinner/Dance (together with financial pressures on members) mean that some Branches are cutting back on these, to be replaced often by a barbecue or social evening and these can often raise sums for the Bell Fund.

5. Business Meetings

The General Committee met twice during the year, in March at Newbury and in September at Newton Longville. On the advice of the Restoration Sub-committee they approved grants to Whitchurch (£50), Hillesdon (£25), and Waltham St. Lawrence (£60). The Towers and Belfries Sub-committee was set up to carry out the work previously done by the late Frederick Sharpe. Subscriptions for resident members were left at 60p, but for 1977 non-resident life subscriptions were increased from 50p to £2 and it was decided that Honorary members should pay no subscription. It was agreed that in future collections at General Guild meetings should go to the Bell Fund rather than the old Restoration Fund and similarly that P.C.C.s should now be encouraged to support the Bell Fund. The committee has also been looking into the formalising of the recording of Guild peals and the publishing in the Annual Report of peals and compositions and a sub-committee is to report shortly. Mr. W. Birmingham has offered 2 fire-resistant boxes for use by the Guild Library. The Librarian is arranging for copies to be available of the Annual Reports for the Guild's first 4 years.

The A.G.M. was held at Aston Clinton with ringing at towers throughout the Chiltern Branch. Like much of the summer the day was very hot — hardly the weather for being indoors. A service was conducted in the Parish Church by Rev. T. Lewis. 125 members were at the business meeting. It was from this meeting that the idea for the Ringing Day came. William Butler was elected Master and Ken Darvill replaced him as General Secretary. The only other changes in the officers were the election of Peter Heritage as a Steward in place of David Cornwall, who stood down after 5 years as a Steward, and the election of Henry Lawrenson as Trustee to succeed the late Mr. Sharpe. Miss E. Sharpe and Mrs. F. Wigg were elected Honorary members. A grant of £20 was made to the Ringing World. The meeting decided the Guild would benefit by having a Peal Secretary and Peter Davies was elected to the post with terms of reference to be agreed by the Committee.

6. Communications

Communications is one of the buzz-words used in industry and commerce and it means 'telling people what is going on and finding out what they want'. Since we are an organisation with about 1800 members from hundreds of towers, it is obviously a matter that must concern us.

The Ringing World continues to give good publicity to Guild happenings and several towers in the Diocese were featured on the front cover and in other articles. I am continuingly surprised at the consistently high standard of The Ringing World's cover articles. It also included fine obituaries following the deaths of Frederick Sharpe and Canon Wigg.

1976 saw the first year in which Member's Diary Cards were produced with a programme card going to each paid-up Guild member. Several of the Branches produce regular Newsletters which as well as being interesting are a useful source of information. In the near future you will see an increasing amount of communication both on a regular basis and for new members, although in my sceptic way I would anticipate that however much we sent out we would still find people who did not know what was going on. However communication is improved if it is a two-way process, so do let your Guild officers have your views, your praises and your citicisms, (if any!).

7. Tower Inspections and Redundant Bells

The Towers and Belfries Sub-committee started work in the middle of 1976, although prior to that some of its members had been making tower inspections. The sub-committee exists largely to continue the work undertaken by Frederick Sharpe — it is a reflection of the amount of work he used to do that a group of eight men are now taking on this work.

Briefly its functions are:

- 1. Inspections of towers and bells in the Diocese, as requested by incumbents or the ringers;
- 2. Keeping clergy and ringers aware of the importance of proper maintenance;
- 3. Maintaining contact with the Diocesan authorities and the relevant Central Council committee on redundant bells.

For the work of inspections, each Branch will have one member of the sub-committee who will be responsible for arranging inspections. He is the best person to contact in the initial stages if you feel that a tower or bells or fittings need inspection, although he will often call additionally on other members of the sub-committee for assistance or experience.

Towers inspected during the year included Englefield, Shinfield, Kintbury, Childrey, Chearsley, Hampstead Norreys, Ilmer, Great Hampden, Aston Sandford, Horsendon, Sandhurst (St. Michael), and Shaw-cum-Donnington. At Hungerford the 6th gudgeon and headstock had parted and Peter Davies is supervising the repair work (largely do-it-yourself).

The advice given by the sub-committee members had been varied in its scope and size, including reports of the work needed. It is hoped that the resulting central file of reports on inspections will assist all concerned.

In December I represented the Guild at a meeting in London organised by the Central Council of Church Bell Ringers (Redundant Bells Committee). Representatives of many Territorial Associations heard of the current position regarding churches made redundant and the alternative uses to which the churches and bells could be put. Although the Oxford Diocese has not yet had many churches made redundant, there are certain to be more declared redundant in the next few years. We should be prepared to give any advice needed to the Diocesan authorities regarding the use or disposal of bells in redundant churches.

MASTER'S REPORT

1976 has been a year of mixed feelings for me. The honour and pleasure of being elected Master of the Guild was tempered by sadness at the loss of our two former Masters. The Guild and the Exercise were well represented at their funerals and memorial services.

The rededication of Shinfield bells was a more happy affair, as were also the social events I attended in the Old North Berks, Newbury and East Berks and South Bucks Branches. I also attended branch and committee meetings in eleven of the fifteen Branches, a total of 22 in all.

As a Guild representative I attended the Central Council meeting at Hereford, and another five committee meetings as a member of its Administrative, Education and Library Committees.

I was pleased to be a member of the team that won the Tewkesbury Shield for the second time and also to be invited to take part in the 12-bell contest held in Leicester. In addition to attending the Guild Striking Contest at Mursley I also judged one of the branch competitions.

As you will read elsewhere the inspection work previously carried out by Mr. Sharpe has been taken over by a Committee. As a member of this I inspected 6 towers in the Southern part of the Diocese and one in Central Bucks. As a member of the Education Committee I assisted at the Easthampstead Course and also ran a 10-week course on Introducing Campanology at Tilehurst. I was invited to give one of the lectures at the ten-week course run by the Middlesex County Assoc. in Fleet Street and I have given three general talks to local organisations.

During 1977 I hope to visit every branch and meet and ring with as many of you as possible. Where possible I will bring the Guild Banner, so if you wish to see it, please invite me!

DEPUTY MASTER'S REPORT (1976)

At the beginning of the year I was thrown unexpectedly into the position of Acting Master by the untimely death of Mr. Fred Sharpe on February 7th. I was able to attend his funeral at Launton and later the Memorial Service at Christ Church. The great diversity of people from all parts of the country who made the effort to attend these services attested to the tremendous respect with which Mr. Sharpe was regarded by the whole ringing fraternity.

I took over the duties of Master until the A.G.M. in July. Sadly, I very soon found myself attending the funerals of two other stalwarts of the Guild, Mr. Charles Coles of Oxford and Canon C. Elliot Wigg, the previous Guild Master and lifelong friend of Mr. Sharpe. Again the services were well attended by ringers paying their last respects to these men as was the Memorial Service for Canon Wigg at Christ Church.

At the Guild Committee Meeting in March it was decided to set up a joint memorial fund for Mr. Sharpe and Canon Wigg which I was pleased to organise. Just under £500 has been collected and permission has been obtained to erect memorial tablets in the cloisters at Christ Church. The question of providing a Master's badge of office as a further memorial has been considered and a number of designs have been prepared by members of the Guild.

The Guild was again invited to take part in the Tewkesbury Shield competition and I organised the band for this event. A more detailed account appears elsewhere in this report. I attended the Central Council meeting at Hereford and nearer home, the very successful Guild course at Easthampstead as well as several Branch meetings, the Guild A.G.M. and both committee meetings.

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow officers and all Guild members for their help, particularly during my term as Acting Master.

EDUCATION SUB-COMMITTEE REPORT FOR 1976

The annual residential course at Easthampstead Park was again very successful with 28 students with a wide range of capabilities attending for three days of intensive theoretical and practical coaching in a variety of ringing topics. The Committee is again very grateful to all the lecturers who gave their time and to all the incumbents who allowed their bells to be rung during the week-end. Increased costs this year meant that for the first time the course ran at a loss, offsetting some of the profits made from previous years. Arrangements for Easthampstead 77 are already in hand.

Day or half-day courses were arranged at Aston Tirrold, Caversham, Great Haseley, Shottesbrooke, and Woughton, the most popular subjects being Plain Hunting and Plain Bob. A series of evening lectures on ringing at Tilehurst was very successful and is being followed by another but a similar course at Langley failed to attract sufficient students at the first attempt; it has now started (January 1977) at the second.

A day course in Bell maintenance at Harwell attracted over 20 students who received theoretical instruction which was followed by practical inspections of three towers with different bell installations. This course will become a regular feature and the next is planned for June 18th 1977. The Bell Maintenance pamphlet produced by the Committee has sold well.

Proficiency certificates for the Guild Striking Competition Final and first quarter peals have been produced and the former were used for the first time at Mursley; the latter are available on request.

Work is in hand to produce a file of data which could be used by anyone, particularly school pupils, who wish to undertake a "project" in Campanology. It is hoped to make this available later this year but its production has been delayed by the departure of the two Committee members working on it — Colin Banton who has moved to Cleveland County and Marie Cross who has returned to Houston, Texas for another temporary stay. Ken Darvill was co-opted to the Committee to help maintain its strength.

This annual report traditionally reminds Guild members that at least one new member should be added to the Committee each year in order to provide a flow of new ideas but a particular need at the present is assistance with the heavy load of administration involved in the organisation of the Easthampstead course.

The Committee also reminds Branches and towers of its offer to arrange any sort of ringing course on any topic from Plain Hunting to Surprise.

OXFORD DIOCESAN BELL FUND

Report of the Managing Trustees for the year ended 31st December 1976

The Managing Trustees held three meetings during the year, all at Diocesan Church House, North Hinksey.

Appeals

The Banbury area and the Slough Trading Estate were chosen as pilot areas for an appeal to firms and 76 firms were circularised with appeal letters in and around Banbury. These met with very poor response with only 12 acknowledgements and no donations received. Nevertheless, it was decided to proceed with the Slough area as the letters had already been printed and could be delivered by hand.

Somewhat more successful were appeals to W.H. Smith and Son Ltd. who responded with a donation of £50, the National Westminster Bank (£5) and Morrells Brewery Ltd. (£5).

Fund Raising

The Annual Christmas Draw made a profit of £105.20 despite the late arrival of the tickets from the printers. The Trustees wish to thank all those who sold tickets at such short notice and those who kindly donated prizes.

At the Grand Ringing Day which replaced the 1976 Guild Festival in October, a levy at each tower produced the sum of £80.99 for the Fund.

A batch of 250 folding cardboard collecting boxes has been purchased and covering labels printed with the name of the Fund. These will be distributed on request and are suitable for use in ringing chambers, private homes etc. It must be emphasised that collecting boxes should be emptied frequently.

Accounts

The accounts of the Fund are published later in this Report. The income to the Capital Accound was £2190.94 for the year bringing the total capital to £3780.35. Of this, £3450 has been invested by the Custodian Trustees.

An income to the Income Account of £131.54 for the year has turned a deficit of £90.50 into a balance of £41.04 at 31st December. At present the Income Account is held in a current account at the National Westminster Bank.

General

The Trustees agreed to publish a regular newsletter which would keep ringers in the Diocese informed of the Fund's activities and progress. It is hoped that this will appear twice a year and the first issue was produced at the end of 1976 and distributed to all the towers in the Diocese with Guild members.

THE TEWKESBURY SHIELD COMPETITION

May 1st is traditionally the first day of Summer. Some people will remember May 1st, 1976, as one of the few wet days during a Summer of heat and drought. Others will remember it as the day on which the fourth Tewkesbury Shield Competition took place. The O.D.G. was competing for the second year running and with the additional stimulus of being the holders of the Shield. This time the Battle of Tewkesbury was fought against the Llandaff and Monmouth Association, who brought a coach-load of supporters, and the Coventry Diocesan Guild as well as the three "regulars".

The O.D.G. band had met on the previous Wednesday at St. Lawrence's Reading to practice the set tough of 305 Grandsire Caters, a very necessary precaution to make sure that everyone knew the method and the conductor knew the calls!

In the Competition itself we were drawn second after Coventry and so there was not much time for nerves to build up. We rang the touch successfully with few mistakes but were not very happy with the general standard of our performance. However, as the chief judge Mr. Roderick Pipe said in his summing up, no band really got hold of the touch but neither did any band disgrace themselves.

Nevertheless, we were very surprised when the results were announced to find that we had won again, this time with 49 faults, with Gloucester & Bristol second (56) and Worcester third (64). The O.D.G. team of Neville Diserens (treble), Helen Diserens (2), Ken Darvill (3), David Cornwall (4), Henry Lawrenson (5), Bill Butler (6), Tim Pett (7 conductor), Bernard Groves (8), Ron Diserens (9) and Peter Davies (Tenor) were each presented with a very beautiful certificate by the Town Mayor.

Later in the year, the annual peal which is granted to the winning association was also brought to a successful conclusion with a rather fast peal of Cambridge Surprise Maximus. So with two competition wins and two peals in two years, Tewkesbury seems to be a lucky place for the O.D.G. Can we do it for a third time in 1977? We have been invited to take part and this time the method is to be Little Bob Royal.

Frederick Sharpe

The sudden death of Fred Sharpe is an immense loss to the Exercise and to the Church generally, both of which he served in so many ways. As a practical ringer he was not outstanding so far as method ringing went, but he had been captain of the local band at Launton since 1927 and could when necessary ring two bells. He had been associated with Launton church since boyhood as chorister, server, ringer since about 1920, and churchwarden since 1932, and in 1955 became a licensed lay reader in the Diocese of Oxford.

As the Central Council's librarian he had custody of an invaluable collection of books and manuscripts on all aspects of bells and ringing, in the care of which he took great pride. But it is his work for the Towers and Belfries Committee, on whose behalf he had carried out hundreds—perhaps thousands—of inspections in many parts of England and Wales, that he deserves most to be remembered. His profession as a master builder—he was until his retirement proprietor of a firm which specialised in the period-type restoration of ancient buildings—combined with his profound knowledge of bell archaeology, enabled him to offer sound advice whatever the problem, and to stand up successfully to those who sought to challenge it, whether architects, church authorities or lawyers.

He was in great demand as a lecturer, particularly at week-end courses, wrote books on the bells of several counties, was for some years deputy Master and at the time of his death Master of the Oxford Diocesan Guild, formed a celebrated band of handbell tune ringers at Launton which had broadcast on numerous occasions since 1951 and made its first appearance on television in 1954, was associated with the American Guild of English Handbell Ringers from its early days and gave freely of his time and money to these and all his other ringing activities, as those who have had the pleasure of visiting the 'den' which he built in his garden to house the library and his other records can testify.

Fred had been a member of the Central Council since 1939, first as an honorary member because of his wide knowledge of bells and belfries, and from 1954 as a life-member. He became a member of the Towers and Belfries Committee in 1946 and convener in 1952, a post he was to hold for some 20 years. He was librarian from 1953 to 1958 and again from 1969 until his death. In 1957 he had the difficult task of following Edwin H. Lewis as president of the Council after the latter had been in office for 27 years. If he was not at his happiest in presiding over the business meetings he always struck the right note when welcoming or thanking church or civic dignitaries. In all his activities he was supported by his wife Janie until her death two years ago, and by his daughter Elizabeth. Though perhaps not well known to the Exercise generally, they made many welcome at 'Derwen', where Fred was ever ready to show ringers round.

Canon C. Elliot Wigg

On the death of the Rev. C.W.O. Jenkyn in 1933 Canon G.F. Coleridge was elected Master of the Diocesan Guild and Elliot Wigg, Deputy. He took his duties conscientiously, spending less time on peal ringing and more on attending meetings. His diary records that in his first year in office (July to December) he attended 13 meetings and many practices: he also notes details of bells where he rang, for he was asked to give advice on restoration work.

Central Council Representative

He became representative for the Oxford University Society on the Central Council in 1935, and held this post until 1953. A regular tour was with the Guild of Clerical Ringers, and he rang in the first peal of Bob Major for this society in April 1938.

During his tours around the Oxford diocese he would inquire where instruction was wanted, and then return and teach: bands were started by him at Dinton and Cuddington in this way. Amongst the peals he rang at this time were silent Stedman Triples and Cambridge Major.

He became Vicar of Chearsley with Nether Winchenden in 1936, and 18 months later recorded his delight when they rang their first 120 of

Doubles for Evensong.

On 5 November 1938 he rang Bray tenor to a peal of seven Minor methods—the 26cwt tenor going very badly at that time—using Fred Sharpe's silencers, the first time that they had been used for a peal. He was a member of Walter Judge's pre-war band attempting peals of Spliced Surprise, and when the ban on ringing stopped peal attempts he attended practices with the clappers tied or removed. It was at this time that he formed a handbell band at Chearsey to ring for service.

Married at Hayes

He was married on 24 February 1941 at Hayes, and a handbell quarter peal was rung for the occasion and early next year he recorded his

first peal on handbells.

The Universities Association elected him a vice-president in January 1946, and the Oxford Guild its Master in the July. In November 1948 he took the living at Wavendon, Bucks, on the edge of the diocese, and for the next few years had little opportunity for ringing. The bells here were restored in 1953, and a new band started.

On 18 November 1961 he was installed as an honorary canon of Christ Church by Rt Rev Dr H J Carpenter, an honour he accepted on behalf of the ringers of the diocese, for it showed the importance of

the work they did in the service of the Church.

In 1965 he rang Great Tom with Fred Sharpe as the train carrying Winston Churchill's body passed through Oxford and after the interment at Bladon conducted a peal of Bob Minor there. In 1968 he left Wavendon for Hook Norton, Oxon. Having moved back to the centre of the Guild he was now able to attend many more meetings which gave him great pleasure. Three years later he was thrilled to baptise his first grand-daughter.

First Signs of Illness

In the latter part of 1972 the first signs of his illness appeared, and he was forced to rest for a long period. He had partially recovered by the following May, and was able to welcome the Central Council to their first meeting in Oxford for 80 years. The following July he retired from the Guild Mastership, his place being taken by Frederick Sharpe, and he was elected a vice-president, the highest honour that the Guild could bestow upon him. The report for that year said; "In his own way he has enriched the Guild as did his predecessors in office—for him the Oxford Diocesan Guild always came first. His constancy and devotion to duty should be an inspiration to us all."

The Branch were privileged to have the use of Woodstock bells for a half muffled peal of Grandsire Triples in their memory, and it was particularly appropriate that they were able to ring at Woodstock, for Fred Sharpe rang his first peal on eight there. PEAL SECRETARY'S REPORT 1976

The total number of peals rung for the Guild in 1976 was 280, of which 233 were rung on tower bells and 47 on handbells. This is the highest annual total ever recorded for the Guild, exceeding the previous highest of 273 in 1972 and exceeding the 1975 total of 222 by 27%. Most of the increase can be attributed to a dramatic rise in the number of peals of Surprise Major — from 60 to 105, including handbell peals.

The following Members rang their first peal in 1976: Patricia Adams, Peter Adams, Jean Blundell, Ian Green, Alison Joyce, Barbara Joyce, Heather Joyce, Malcolm Joyce, Albert Kibble, Andrew Larkin, Amanda Lees, Richard Lunzar, Alison Milford, William Mills, Ronald Payne, Hazel Platzer, David Seymour, Philippa Thomson, Ronald Thorne, Jane Trotman, Dereck Williams, Michael Williams, Andrew Young. Albert Kibble waited until he was 67 before ringing his first peal and Ron Thorne has at last found time inbetween Guild activities to ring his. The Joyce family seem to have taken to peal ringing en bloc.

In all, 369 members rang peals for the Guild.

Leading towers were: Hungerford 10, West Wycombe 9, Hughenden 8, Caversham, Hitcham and Witney 5 each, Dorney, Highclere (Hants), Newbury, Reading (St. Lawrence), Reading (St. Mary), and Slough 4 each.

Peals at Shabbington and Halton were the first on the bells. The latter was the solitary peal of Minimus, sponsored for the Bell Restoration Fund, a first for three of the band and first as conductor for the fourth member of the band.

Sixteen peals were associated with the passing of Elliott Wigg and Frederick Sharpe. One of these, at St. Giles', Oxford was rung by eight Guild Officers and another at Speen was appropriately of five methods with Oxford in their names.

Sixteen peals were the first peals in the method:—Minor: Ascension Day Treble Bob, Grandsirish Delight; Surprise Minor: Marcham, Midgham, Norwichish, Padworth, Pangbourne, Premierish; Major: Barker's Exercise; Surprise Major: Bodicote, Darius, Tombelataurea Lomeanor, Uganda, Vale of the White Horse, Zululand; Fourteen-in: Cambridge Surprise. First peals on Handbells of Rutland Surprise Royal and Lincolnshire Surprise Maximus were rung.

Other notable peals included Cambridge Surprise Maximus at Tewkesbury by the successful Tewkesbury Shield band with two assistants and Hughenden Surprise Major by the local band at Hughenden on the 40th anniversary of the first peal in the method there. Another 40-year anniversary peal, of Stedman Triples, at Hughenden was rung with four members of the original band including the conductor. Peter Holden's Surprise Minor band worked up to 41 methods in a peal of 8640 changes at St. Nicholas', Abingdon and the rare and unusual method Eryri was rung at Highclere. Some handbell peals have already been mentioned and the Cambridge Surprise Fourteen-in should have a special mention. The High Wycombe band rang the first all-the-work peal of Spliced Surprise Royal in 4 standard methods.

Among other special events for which peals were rung were birth-days of Fred Orchard (90), Len Stilwell (86) and Harry Badger (75). Arthur Barker's birthday was marked by the first peal in the method of Barker's Exercise and another well known Guild Member was connected with a peal of Spliced Bill and Birmingham Surprise Major at Highclere. Thanks for a lifetime of service to Hitcham church by George James Berry (90) were given in a peal there.

Three well known peal ringing couples were married during the year and peals were rung in celebration in each case. They were: Graham Firman and Katherine Maundrell, Andrew Haseldine and Julie Tyler and Peter Holden and Barbara Gell.

ANALYSIS OF QUARTER PEALS 1976

During the year, The Ringing World recorded 584 quarter peals in 183 different towers in the Guild. Of this total, 204 (35%) were rung on a Sunday and 105 (18%) were rung in memoriam. The total in 1976 is 13% higher than the 1975 total of 518 and this increase is largely due to 54 quarters which were rung in memoriam Fred Sharpe and/or Canon Wigg.

The total was composed of Minimus 7, Doubles 174, Minor 139, Triples 140, Major 104, Caters 11, Royal 4, and Cinques 1. The largest difference was the increase of 40% (from 99 to 139) in quarters of Minor.

119 quarters (20%) involved a "first" of some description - a similar proportion to 1975 and there were 439 firsts in all, 10% more than last year.

The number of quarters rung in each Branch, with the 1975 total in brackets was: Banbury 31 (18), Bicester 14 (18), Central Bucks 39 (32), Chiltern 18 (7), Chipping Norton 24 (17), East Berks and South Bucks 116 (100), Newbury 52 (38), North Bucks 45 (16), Old North Berks 45 (65), Oxford City 60 (45), Reading 59 (51), Sonning 16 (22), South Oxon 45 (39), Vale of the White Horse 8 (11), and Witney and Woodstock 36 (39). Thus totals in 10 Branches increased and totals in the remainder fell. The most dramatic difference was achieved by the North Bucks Branch which rang nearly three times as many quarters as it did in 1975.

The most popular methods were Grandsire Triples 80, Plain Bob Minor 74, Grandsire Doubles 53 and Plain Bob Doubles 52. These were the four most popular in 1975 but Plain Bob Minor has jumped from fourth place to second in order of popularity. 66 Doubles quarters of more and one method were rung and Grandsire and Plain Bob was the most popular combination.

The towers recording the greatest number of quarters were: Tilehurst 24, Newbury and Shabbington 21, Windsor (St. John Baptist) 19, Long Crendon 18 and Slough 17. All these towers were among the leaders in 1975 but the leading tower in Oxfordshire became Witney (12) with three times as many as in 1975. Other towers which rang significantly more quarters in 1976 than in 1975 included Aston Clinton, Burford, High Wycombe, Hughenden and Marston (Oxford).

Quarters seem to have been more uniformly distributed through the Branches than in 1975 when only three Branches rang them in more than half their ringable towers; in 1976 no fewer than 11 of the 15 Branches achieved this, only Central Bucks, Chiltern, North Bucks and Vale of the White Horse did not.
